

CSI has five priority areas which all center around a healthy and safe pregnancy—the care mothers receive during pregnancy, childbirth, and immediately after birth. After birth, the level of health and social support a mother receives to ensure she's healthy, strong, and informed to take care of herself and her newborn. These are major vulnerability windows resulting in high rates of preventable deaths and disabilities. In collaboration with local and international partners, CSI's low-cost low-tech grassroots efforts to #SaveMothersofAfrica are impacting lives of women, their families, and communities. CSI CEO, Ms. Tausi Suedi, will highlight CSI's successes in saving lives of mothers and newborns, eduempowering adolescent girls, providing social supportive services for adolescents and youth including orphans and vulnerable children, and much more. She will also share opportunities for collaboration and increase awareness on impact of rising health burdens on development and economic prosperity across the continent.
